Annemarie Angelo cared for critically ill patients as a nurse for 34 years. Now in retirement, her work as a volunteer and as a **Legacy Society** Member at Placer Community Foundation continues that commitment of care.

Annemarie built a prolific career, beginning at Kaiser Hospital in Hollywood, and leading nurses in the hospital's first intensive and cardiac care units. As a founding nurse in these units she was called upon to instruct and supervise the nurses ongoing, specializing in newer technology. Annemarie left Los Angeles and moved to Sun City Roseville where she soon became a volunteer for the public elementary schools.

While meeting with her estate planning attorney, Penny Changaris, about leaving a portion of her estate through bequest to charity, Annemarie recalls, *"I explained that I wanted to be assured the money would go where it is needed and she was quick to tell me about Placer Community Foundation."*

Annemarie established a giving plan that will someday become a charitable fund in her name supporting animal welfare and the performing arts. Now a member of the Legacy Society, Annemarie regularly participates in PCF events to learn how grants from donor funds are impacting the community.

"I really enjoy being around other people who give," she states. "And I admire Placer Community Foundation's efforts to keep us informed of where the dollars are going because that is what keeps us all motivated to do more."
